WEEK 1 — PRAY

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Before we consider candidates and issues, let's pray. Scripture calls us to pray "for kings and all those in authority" (1 Tim. 2:1–2). Pray that leaders and candidates would seek the Lord, repent where needed, and depend on God for wisdom, courage, and strength. Ask God to turn their hearts toward righteousness (Prov. 21:1), help them reject ungodly counsel, resist pressure to violate conscience, and govern with justice for the vulnerable (Ps. 72:1–4). As voters, we should look for capable, trustworthy leaders who honor God and hate dishonest gain (Ex. 18:21), remembering all leaders are accountable to God (Dan. 2:21).

WEEK 2 — LEARN

Pray. Learn. Engage. Vote

Take time this week to review your ballot, with special attention to local and state races and issues. Research unfamiliar candidates, offices, judges, and ballot measures so the process feels less overwhelming. Pray for discernment as you learn. Consider each choice through biblical principles such as human dignity, biblical justice, stewardship, religious liberty, care for the vulnerable, and the proper role of government. Use trustworthy sources, including biblically-based voter guides, and seek to understand the strongest arguments on each side.

WEEK 3 — ENGAGE

Pray. Learn. Engage. Vote.

This week, take the time to discuss a candidate or ballot issue with a family member, friend, or neighbor. Listen carefully, ask thoughtful questions that will challenge them to think biblically, and represent other viewpoints fairly. Christian civic engagement should be marked by the truth of a biblical worldview, humility, courage, and love—not anger or contempt.

Political conversations are opportunities to demonstrate that disagreement does not require division. Before speaking, consider: Am I seeking to understand? Are my claims accurate and based on God's word? Am I treating others as image-bearers?

WEEK 4 — VOTE

Complete all parts of your ballot and return by the deadline. Colorado's General Election is Tuesday, November 3, 2026. Your ballot must be received by 7:00 p.m. on Election Day; a postmark does not count. When Election Day is near, use an official ballot drop box or voting center rather than relying on mail.
