Biblical Principle	Questions to Ask	Key Scripture
Sanctity of Human Life	Does this protect human life and the vulnerable?	Genesis 1:27; Psalm 139:13–16
Justice	Does this promote justice, fairness, and accountability?	Micah 6:8; Romans 13:1–4
Human Dignity	Does this honor every person as made in God's image?	Genesis 1:26–27; James 3:9
Marriage & Family	Does this strengthen families and support parents?	Genesis 2:24; Ephesians 6:1–4
Religious Freedom	Does this protect the free exercise of faith?	Acts 5:29; Galatians 5:1
Stewardship	Is this a wise and responsible use of resources?	Genesis 2:15; Luke 16:10
Care for the Vulnerable	How does this affect those in need?	Proverbs 31:8–9; James 1:27
Personal Responsibility	Does this encourage responsibility, work, and integrity?	2 Thessalonians 3:10; Colossians 3:23
Role of Government	Is this an appropriate responsibility for government?	Romans 13:1–7; 1 Peter 2:13–17
Truth & Integrity	Are the facts accurate and honestly presented?	Proverbs 12:22; Ephesians 4:25
Love of Neighbor	Does this seek the common good and love others well?	Matthew 22:37–39; Jeremiah 29:7

Pray • Learn • Engage • Vote

Step	Application
Pray	Ask God for wisdom and discernment (James 1:5).
Learn	Study the issues, candidates, and ballot language carefully.
Engage	Discuss respectfully, seek wise counsel, and encourage thoughtful civic participation.
Vote	Vote according to your biblically informed convictions and continue praying for your community.
